- A** For this congregation, that, having received the mercy of Jesus, we find ways to bring God’s mercy to the people around us—family, co-workers, friends, and strangers alike. We pray especially for children in vulnerable situations—those not yet born, those experiencing family division, and those struggling with poverty. Show us how to extend to these little ones mercy and to open our arms to them as Jesus did. God of mercy,
