- P As God's beloved, we are urged to pray in the Holy Spirit.


- Lord Jesus, we confess that we neglect to converse with You in prayer and to guide our prayer life according to Your Word and Your will. Forgive us and remember us.

- Lord Jesus, we confess that we neglect opportunities to share Your saving grace with others. Forgive us and remember us.


Silence for private confession

NICENE CREED


POST-COMMUNION THANKSGIVING
