✠ PREPARATION ✠

Today we will observe The Lord's Supper... *The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Grace Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked you first to speak with the pastor, an elder or an usher. (For further study, see Matthew 5:23f; 10:32f; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:17-34). Wine is used in the individual and common cup. (The purple cup is grape juice.) It may also be received by intinction. A gluten free wafer is available upon request.*

ENTRANCE RITE

All assemblies begin somehow. How an event begins sets the mood and the theme. The Star Wars starts with a rolling screen, that updates us on the story: "A long time ago and a galaxy far far away..." Some congregations begin the service with a pastor welcoming the congregants; some churches begin with long praise band performances. Liturgical worship generally includes three particular elements: an opening hymn, a procession and an invocation.

The opening hymn is the first element of the liturgical worship service. It is often selected based on the theme of the sermon and the lectionary readings. The opening hymn signals a transition: we are leaving ordinary life to enter the presence of God.

The congregation stands during the opening hymn to honor God. A recognition of the holy event in which the people are about to take part.
