♣ PREPARATION **♣**

Today we will observe The Lord's Supper...The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Grace Lutheran Church in the confession and alad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked you first to speak with the pastor, an elder or an usher. (For further study, see Matthew 5:23f; 10:32f; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; I Cor. 11:17-34). Wine is used in the individual and common cup. (The purple cup is grape juice.) It may also be received by intinction. A gluten free wafer is available upon request.




Silence for self-examination

COLLECT OF THE DAY EXPLAINED

Historically, the Collect of the Day is the second clue as to what the day's theme will be. Each Sunday, there is a historical prayer for the day assigned. The prayer of the day changes week by week and reflects the theme of the church lectionary.

Collects have a very particular structure, almost poetic. The pastor begins with the customary greeting, "The Lord be with you," and the congregation responds, "And also with you." The prayer begins with an address to the Father, followed by one or more divine attributes that relate to the remainder of the prayer. Then, there is a singular petition, followed by the desired result of that petition. Finally, the prayer invokes the name of Christ, who is, as a mediator, the means by which the believers are able to approach God, the Father, in prayer.

The collect of the day serves as a transition point from a time of repentance, praise and celebration to a time of scripture readings, contemplation, and, ultimately, the sermon.



NICENE CREED






POST COMMUNION THANKSGIVING
