
Today we will observe The Lord's Supper... The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Grace Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked you first to speak with the pastor, an elder or an usher. (For further study, see Matthew 5:23f; 10:32f; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; I Cor. 11:17-34). Wine is used in the individual and common cup. (The purple cup is grape juice.) It may also be received by intinction. A gluten free wafer is available upon request.



LECTIONARY EXPLAINED

The earliest lectionary were used in the synagogue. Some of those lectionaries were daily, and some of them were weekly. Early Christians continued to practice of assigning readings to holy days. Different regions of the church through different points of history had different lectionaries. By 800 A.D. a standard set of one-year readings was used. This one-year lectionary was retained through the reformation. A three-year election was developed in the '60s through a Vatican council set of three-year readings focused on giving a greater understanding of texts and giving preachers a greater range of preaching.



PREFACE




