THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

September 1, 2024

→ PREPARATION →

Today we will observe The Lord's Supper... The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Grace Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked you first to speak with the pastor, an elder or an usher. (For further study, see Matthew 5:23f; 10:32f; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; I Cor. 11:17-34). Wine is used in the individual and common cup. (The purple cup is grape juice.) It may also be received by intinction. A gluten free wafer is available upon request.

READINGS EXPLAINED

The divine service in the Lutheran tradition consists of at least three scripture readings. The appointed Gospel, with a Psalm and an Old Testament lesson, is chosen to complement the Gospel. The epistles are read weekly bit by bit, generally in order. The Coptic church reads eight lessons a week. Low-liturgical churches might only use one reading.

In the earliest liturgies, the Old Testament reading was prominent, but as the New Testament was written and circulated, the Old Testament lesson took a more supportive role.

In worship, the pastor fills his prophetic role as foreteller as he brings the word of God to the congregation. He faces the congregation, speaking for God as his duly appointed minister. The reading of scripture in public is not original to the Christian church but naturally flows out of synagogue worship. Christians, unlike other world religions, only use readings from Sacred Scripture.

While private reading of the Bible is to be encouraged, God gave the Bible primarily for the in-person reading of corporate gatherings and worship.



APOSTLES' CREED







forever and ever. Amen.




